

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Dear Friends,

2011 was, admittedly, a year fraught with challenges and economic difficulties. But it was also a year of hope, new beginnings, and the positive change that can only occur when we join and face our challenges together. And that is the story of 2011 that we would like to share with you.

Through the year, we worked together with colleagues, businesses, grantmakers, supporters, and community organizations to launch new initiatives, reach more people in more places, and help clients achieve their goals.

At PFCS, we believe that all of our clients have the ability — and the right — to recover from mental illness and addiction and embrace life. Working together with each individual who came through our doors, we helped clients gain new understanding of the issues affecting their lives and create a plan to pursue personal, professional, and educational goals. Our PROSper program (Personalized Recovery Oriented Services for people engaged in rehabilitation), for instance, successfully helped people achieve their dream of getting a job; our percentage of competitively employed clients was one of the highest in PROS programs throughout the state!

On a county level, 2011 was a remarkable year in terms of our ability to reach out and support the children of Putnam. Through our SEED program (Social Emotional/Early Development) we forged strong community ties with local daycare centers and service providers, working together to screen and treat young children for early behavioral and emotional issues. PFCS was also awarded a grant by the NY State Office of Mental Health to launch a new early recognition and screening program, which will enable our Mental Health Clinic to continue serving Putnam's youth and linking children with the services they need to grow up happy and healthy.

And our work with children didn't stop there! PFCS partnered with several school districts in Putnam to help students learn to address the common pressures of school and social life. Our prevention educators taught children to recognize and avoid bullying — both in-person and online — and we, as members of the Putnam County Communities That Care Coalition, helped to train high school students about the dangers of driving under the influence through SIDNE (Simulated Impaired Driving Experience).

Thanks to community partnerships, we were also able to strengthen PFCS from the inside out. With generous grants from the Dyson Foundation and IBM, we are upgrading our technology and putting new systems in place so that we can serve our clients more efficiently.

We are proud of all that we, and our clients, accomplished together in 2011. It was a year that proved we do not need to be limited by our challenges or the uncertainty of the future. With determination and your support, we can keep moving forward — and PFCS will do just that, continuing to provide quality mental health and chemical dependency services that enrich the lives of our Putnam community.






